RESPONSIVE READING


In the rising of the sun and in its going down, we remember them.

AFFIRMATIONS


(Invitation to say together)



THOSE INJURED AND THEIR CARERS Robyn Greening


I come representing those who suffer the effects of road trauma in body, mind and spirit and those who care for them. (Brief silence)

HEALTH AND HEALING SERVICES Leanne Hyndman


